What Christmas traditions does your family have that have endured time or have changed? I remember as a child we always gathered on Christmas Eve with my dad's family but I have no recollection of what we ate because we were too excited as we waited to open gifts. Christmas Day was always spent with my mom's side of the family and often included snowmobiling or sledding down at the river on their

farm. As times changed and our families grew, we started to have our gatherings with our own immediate family. It always included meatballs and lutefisk on Christmas Eve <u>and</u> Christmas Day, because neither family had eaten their share of lutefisk prior to that gathering! We now (thanks to a newer generation), have a variety of meats for Christmas. Finally, the kids must recite their Christmas program pieces prior to any gift opening.

Life is full of changes, like the first holiday you are apart from your family due to distance or death. As time goes on and you get older (and hopefully wiser), you realize it really isn't that important if the Christmas tree sits in the same spot each year at your house or at the church? The same decorations don't always need to be carefully placed in that same certain order? If the kids put all the ornaments at their eye level, well, it really doesn't matter. Nevertheless, we naturally fear change and are anxious if things aren't the way they have always been. However, we need to remember that God has a plan for us just as he had plans for Mary and Joseph. Plans I am sure neither Mary or Joseph would have chosen on their own. The following message from Billy Graham was published in Decision magazine in 1983.

Think back to that first Christmas about 2,000 years ago. It was probably late at night on the plains just a few miles outside the little village of Bethlehem. The stars shone like diamonds in the sky, and a little band of weary shepherds had settled down to sleep on the cold, rocky ground. They had no reason to expect that this night would be different from any other night, just as you may think that nothing is going to change in your own life. But God had other plans. This was the night that would be the most important night in human history, the night when God Himself would come to Earth. Listen to Luke's account of that remarkable night: *"And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:9-11, KJV).*

So, whether your holiday this year is the same as every other year or whether there has been a change in your life, remember that God has a plan for you and embrace it like Mary and Joseph did over 2,000 years ago. May you be blessed this holiday season. Lou Ann Lee

The Emmanuel Lutheran Church council met on November 5, 2019, with the following members present: Kevin Paczkowski, Deb Syvertsen, Jessica Kappes, Lesley Hulne, Austin Heyen, and Intern Pastor Meggie Bjerkness. Absent: Fred Tol and Mardee Besette.

Call to Order: President Kevin Paczkowski called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Meggie led the council in opening devotions from the book "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young.

Pastor's Report: Intern Pastor Meggie discussed the possibility of investing in a church software called Breeze. It is a way to keep all contact info centralized as well as many other clerical duties. A motion to further look into this was made and approved. A visitation and mileage report was received. Motion to approve was made, seconded and passed.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from last meeting read. Motion to approve, seconded and passed. Treasurer's Report: Kevin read the treasurer's report sent to him by Lou Ann. Motion to approve was made, seconded and passed. Noisy offering on the 1st and 3rd Sundays in October went to Richland PB & J in the amount of \$49.22. Pamela Krump and Intern Meggie. The meeting was called to order by President Brice. The minutes of the October 14th meeting was read by Pamela. A motion by Larry, seconded by Kendra to accept the secretary's report. Motion carried. The treasurer's report was provided by Kendra. A motion by Pamela, seconded by Marissa to accept the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Intern Pastor Report: Intern Pastor Meggie provided her mileage report to the council members which also included her pastoral visitations. She continues to struggle with locating contact info for members and asked for suggestions. She is currently looking at a program called Breeze. It is \$50 per month and it would serve as a church directory and also be used for mass communication needs. She will be providing more information to Kendra and Pamela to discuss at future meeting if it is something we should pursue. Intern Pastor Meggie provided the council proposed continued education dates she would like to schedule. Pamela made a motion to approve the dates and Kendra seconded the motion. Motion carried.
