

#### **Emmanuel Lutheran Council Highlights**

The Emmanuel Lutheran Church council met on August 18th after worship. Present were Jessica Kappes, Sharon Tschakert, Tessa Tschakert, Don Hestdalen, Treasurer Lou Ann Lee, and Janelle Hansen. Janelle opened the meeting with devotions.

**Secretary's Report**: Tessa read the secretary's minutes from the July meeting. Don made a motion to accept with a second by Tessa. Approved.

**Treasurer's Report**: Lou Ann presented the treasurer's report. The church propane was recently filled. Emmanuel received a generous anonymous donation to be

applied to the flooring fund. One new laptop was purchased by Lou Ann, as per the two councils' agreement. Emmanuel has reimbursed Lou Ann and Galchutt has been billed for their half of the laptop. The spending as it relates to the budget categories was presented with the note that the categories will be adjusted once the 3 months due from Galchutt is received. Tessa made a motion to accept with a second by Don. Approved.

**Education**: Sunday school will start on September 19th and be held the first and third Sundays unless there is a conflict. Flyers are being prepared that Jessica will send to families.

**Property**: Lou Ann reported that there are some shingles on the north side of the church and the steeple that have lifted likely due to all the winds this summer. She checked with our insurance company, and they suggested we see what it will cost to repair prior to submitting a claim. Tessa will let Fred know the name of a person who may be able to fix the shingles and do the steeple work that was previously discussed. The bottom shelf in the storage area has collapsed. Fred will be asked to see what we need to fix this as it holds the roasters. Lou Ann reported that Michael is currently building a new frame for the outside sign that was in dire need of repair.

#### New business:

- The first fall service will be September 12 where we will return to the normal liturgy. We will have a 9 AM service that day since Galchutt has Rally Day. Communion will be held on September 19.
- God's Work, Our Hands Sunday was discussed. Don will check with Lenny Krueger to see if there is something the church could help with for a project.
- Jolene has resigned as church custodian, so we need to look for a replacement.
- We will start getting estimates on what replacing the dining room flooring will cost. Even with the most recent generous donation, the flooring fund is likely a long way from what is needed but we need estimates to know when we can proceed.
- Lou Ann stated that she heard a company was repairing cemetery stones at the Walcott church cemetery. She will have them give us an estimate on what it would cost to fix the stones that are in most need of repairs at this time. Once we know the cost, we may want to contact families of decedents for fundraising purposes. This will be an item to be discussed at the annual meeting.
- The annual meatball dinner and raffle is being scheduled for December 5th. Tessa will start contacting donors for the raffle donations.
- There was discussion on having a "meet and greet" for Pastor Janelle like what was done when Pastor Michael started.
- Janelle will be at Fair Hills for pastor's retreat in September. Next meeting will be September 14 at 6:30 PM. Tessa moved to adjourn the meeting with a second by Jessica.

This month, America marks the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, which ended almost 3,000 lives and changed life forever for millions more. The nation was shaken to its very roots, with violence jolting out of us any assumption that "it can't happen here."

The students comprise of the following churches: Galchutt Lutheran Church, Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Our Saviors' Lutheran Church, and Richland Lutheran Church. If you have a friend who would

also like to join confirmation, they are welcome to join! All are welcome to learn about the abundance of God's grace and love!

We will be using the 3-year cycle **Colaborate Lutheran Confirmation curriculum.** This year's focus is on Lutheran History and Catechism. I can't wait to get to know your students! I have high expectations for attendance, worship attendance/sermon notes, and participation because I truly desire for your child to grow in their faith. Confirmation is a privilege, it is not a graduation from church, but it is just the beginning of their faith journey. Christ walks with them and loves them just as they are and continues throughout their lifetime. Confirmation is practicing their "adult" membership recognizing, we never quit learning.


