### **BE SOMEONE'S MIRACLE**

Miracles happen every day, if we just look around us. They aren't reserved for just the best of souls or the most elite. In fact, God has helped out some of us who might be considered major screw-ups. The wonder of each miracle is that it is a gift being offered unexpectedly when one needs it most.

Some miracles are huge, jaw-dropping moments, like a terminal patient being cured, a pocketed Bible stopping a lethal bullet, Jesus walking on water. But many others are quieter, yet just as impactful. Our challenge as Christians is to look carefully around us, to notice what others need. It isn't always obvious but sometimes what is a very small gesture on our part can change the life of someone else, like a note of thanks, a phone call, sharing garden produce with a food pantry, assisting at a soup kitchen, a friendly visit. As we prepare LWR school kits and quilts, I have felt many times that it is a miracle that someone has provided the things we need so that we can continue to be a miracle for someone around the world and at home. Thank you for being led by the Spirit to provide. Our one small gesture can be someone's miracle.

The Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council met on September 14, 2021. In attendance were Sharon Tschakert, Jessica Kappes, Craig Syvertsen, Don Hestdalen, Lesley Hulne, and Pastor Janelle. President Jessica called the meeting to order.

Pastor's Report: Janelle attended the Pastor's Retreat at Fair Hills recently. She is

setting Wednesday as her dedicated local office day, as well as teaching Confirmation Class in the late afternoon. She will get the mileage reimbursement process started and will be starting visitation soon.

**Secretary's Report**: The report was given and approved in a motion by Sharon and second by Don. **Treasurer's Report**: Jessica presented the Treasurer's Report provided by Lou Ann. The treasurer's report was approved in a motion by Sharon and second by Donald.

**Education Committee**: We will offer Sunday School, starting September 19 at 9:30 AM. Masking will be optional and parents are asked to keep ill children home.

**Property**: They are still working on finding someone to do the roof/steeple repair. The shelving in the back room will be repaired.

Worship: The committee will meet with Galchutt to pick out hymns.

The Galchutt Church Council met on September 15th at 6:30 PM at Galchutt Lutheran Church. Members present were Pamela Krump, Alex Paczkowski, Doug Johnson, Logan Biffert, Daniel Dockter, and Pastor Janelle Hansen. Pamela called the meeting to order, Janelle started meeting with a devotion and prayer. Alex read secretary's report, Doug made a motion to accept secretary's report and Logan seconded. Pamela presented

the treasury report from Kendra, Alex made a motion to accept treasury report and Daniel seconded. **Pastor's Report**: Janelle has been our pastor for about 10 days. She mentioned that confirmation will start Wednesday, September 22, in Colfax from 3:30-5:00 PM. She went to a retreat/conference on Monday, September 13, at Fair Hills Resort. She performed Betty Syvertsen's funeral on September 9 with Pastor Jeff McCracken. This semester Janelle has 2 classes that started this week and will go until mid-November. Pastor Janelle will be out on October 31 and Kim Adams will be pulpit supply. She currently has 1 shut-in visitation on the schedule and her office hours will be Wednesdays at Emmanuel. She briefly discussed why she is called a SAM (Synod Authorized Minster) pastor instead of intern pastor.
