Emmanuel Lutheran Council Highlights

The Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council met on October 6, 2021. In attendance were Sharon Tschakert, Jessica Kappes, Fred Tol, Tessa Tschakert, Lesley Hulne, Treasurer Lou Ann Lee, and Pastor Janelle. President Jessica called the meeting to order, and Janelle led us in devotion.

Pastor's Report: Janelle reported that the Lutefisk Supper at Richland will be cancelled for October 29, 2021. Visitations are going well. She had her interview for acceptance into the TEEM Program with Wartburg Seminary, Teem and EaND Synod members. Her tuition for Fall Semester is \$480, so far. She is taking part in the Christian Colts program at Richland HS Thursday mornings. Janelle submitted her mileage for September, and Fred moved to pay her mileage. Sharon seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Secretary's Report: The report was given and approved in a motion by Tessa and second by Sharon.

Treasurer's Report: Lou Ann presented the treasurer's report. The annual Lewis Nelson Trust fund money was received this month. \$500 of the amount from the fund will be transferred to the cemetery account, as this is one of the possible uses, and donations to the cemetery fund have been less this year but expenses have stayed steady. Tessa made a motion to accept the report, Sharon seconded, and the motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Education: Sunday School has resumed. The next scheduled is October 17.

Property: Fred is working on repairing the shelving unit. They have found someone to call about the steeple/louver repair. We will start getting bids to replace the flooring in the basement.

Worship: The committee will meet with Galchutt in November to choose hymns. We discussed a Thanksgiving Eve Service.

Stewardship: Tessa has ordered the raffle tickets and they will be available soon for members to begin selling. An invitation will be extended to local children to take part in the October 31 church service, by attending wearing their Halloween costumes.

Old Business: We are still looking for a custodian, and some names were recommended.

New Business: The council will host a Meet and Greet for Pastor Janelle on November 14 following worship. Tessa will see if the community hall is available. Christmas Eve service will be at 5:30 PM. We talked about possibly starting Beer & Hymns again in January 2022.

The next meeting is November 3, 2021. Tessa moved to adjourn the meeting. Fred seconded the motion and it carried. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Pamela called the meeting to order. Pastor Janelle led with a devotion and prayer. Alex read secretaries report, Logan accepted report and Doug seconded. There was no treasury report.

Pastor Report: Pastor Janelle has been doing visitations where she can and who she is aware of. She attended Christian Colts at Richland High School. There will be no confirmation on October 19. She is registered for her winter classes and will be attending on campus January 23-29.

A new Thanksgiving tradition

At Thanksgiving, we give thanks for things (food, home, clothing, work) and loved ones (family, friends, pets). But if the people we name aren't present, they may never know how precious they are to us. This November, start a new tradition by writing notes of thanks to people you appreciate.

Follow Paul's model of starting letters with thanksgiving: "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is being reported all over the world" (Romans 1:8, NIV). Notice how he thanks his addressees by thanking God for them. Paul is specific too, not writing, "Thanks for everything!"

Expressing genuine thanksgiving to God and another person, you might write something like this: *Dear Judy, This Thanksgiving I'm thinking about special people in my life. You are one! I thank God for our friendship, for your strong witness for Jesus and for your willingness to lend a hand as a substitute teacher. (Your chocolate cookies are icing on the cake!) I praise God for you! Sincerely, Joan*


