

# TM035E Lutheran Confessions: "Justification by Faith Alone"

The Book of Concord tells us that because people cannot, by their powers, live according to the law of God and because all are under sin and guilty of eternal wrath and death, we cannot be set free from sin and be justified through the law. Instead, what has been given us is the promise of the forgiveness of sins and justification on account of Christ, who was provided for us to make satisfaction for the sins of the world, and who has been appointed as the mediator and propitiator. This promise is not conditional upon our merits; it freely offers the forgiveness of sins and justification, just as Paul says, "If it is by works, it is no longer based on grace" (Romans 11:6). Elsewhere Paul adds, "Apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed" (Romans 3:21). The forgiveness of sins is offered freely.

So it is nothing we do. It is all that God does for us through Jesus Christ's resurrection on the cross. "For through the law, I died to the law so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:19-20).

People of God, let us love each other as Christ has loved us; we do this when we have faith in God and listen to the good news of the Gospels. "Therefore we have buried with him by baptism into death, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). When we do this, we live by way of the Lord.

We are broken people who need the Lord and the love He offers us. God wants us to love each other as Christ has loved us. Remembering it is nothing we do but all God does for us. Love like Jesus. Peace.


