Mark Moen was awarded a Quilt of Valor during services at Galchutt Church on May 30, 2022. Mark served in the United States Army active duty from January 1978 to October 1998.

He served in El Salvador as a Civil War Advisor in 1982. It was not a named operation but was considered a combat/ hazardous duty location. He served 2 tours in Panama, the first from 1982-1986 and the second from 1988-1989 in Operation Just Cause. Mark's primary duty was 180A Special Forces Warrant Officer. Mark notes his memorable events to be Operation Just Cause. He spent a great deal of time deployed to various countries training their soldiers. Mark enjoyed a couple of years on the Jump Ambassadors demonstration parachute team. His unit had the responsibility of representing the 193rd Infantry Brigade in Panama. He spent most of his career at Ft. Bragg, NC.

We have received so many nice cards with the donations for the Emmanuel cemetery restoration project that I want to share just a few of those with everyone.

Enclosed please find my donation to your cemetery repair raising effort.

My name is Gordon Olson and I'm the son of Lionel and Mary Olson, children of Baldwin and Emma Olson. I happen to be the oldest Grandson of Baldwin and Emma. Three generations of my family are at rest in the West cemetery starting with Nels Olson. Donald Rittenhouse, husband of Ellen Rittenhouse, and I share the same Great Grandfather, making Donald and I second cousins. I also have relatives in East cemetery. Emma Olson's brother Lenas Danielson, his wife Elsie and son Vernon are buried there. So much for my brief genealogy overview.

Another connection I have with the cemeteries happened in year 2001. My wife Shirley and I, along with Donald Rittenhouse, walked the West Cemetery and recorded information on the tombstones. This information, together with similar information of the East Cemetery provided by the church was placed on the internet by Shirley and can be viewed by anyone interested in this genealogy information.

Thank you for calling me back yesterday. I really appreciated our conversation. It really brought back memories and images of our numerous enjoyable summer visits to Abercrombie when my sisters and I were growing up.

I am enclosing a check (#12272612) for the Emmanuel Lutheran Cemetery fund for the refurbishment of the monuments. Thank you for taking on this important project – as well as for reaching out to the distant family members.

My wife Kathie and I are sending this donation on behalf of and in memory of my father and mother – Robert and Lois Skamfer, and in memory of all our relatives who are buried in the Emmanuel Lutheran Cemetery. Dad passed away on November 25, 2020, and was the last remaining member of the "Abercrombie Skamfers". I know that Dad would support this project without a doubt.

I know of eight Skamfers buried in the Emmanuel Cemetery. Lars and Randi Flaa Skamfer are my great-grandparents, and both came from Rennebu, Norway at a young age. Their son Emil was married to Olga Nypen, and they are my grandparents. Jens Skamfer, also of Rennebu, was the brother of Lars. Bertine Christine Skamfer (Bertha) was Emil's sister. She died of diphtheria at the age of eight and was buried in the Emmanuel Cemetery in 1906. My uncles, LeRoy and Harold Skamfer are also buried in the cemetery. The two of them farmed the nearby family farm until their retirements in the mid-1980's.

We are also related to the Nypens who are buried in the Emannuel Cemetery. Andrew and Mary Nypen are Olga's parents and my great-grandparents.

The Emmanuel Church Council met on June 21, 2022, with the following members present: Pastor Janelle, Craig Syvertsen, LouAnn Lee, Sharon Tschakert, Lesley Hulne, Julie Lehman and Tessa Tschakert.

Meeting was called to order by VP Sharon Tschakert and Pastor Janelle led us in devotions.

Secretary's Report: Report was read by Tessa. Lesley made a motion to approve with a second by LouAnn. All passed.

Treasurer's report: Lou Ann reported a new water heater was installed and some extra plumbing work to accommodate the install was needed. Piano was tuned in the church. A down payment was made to Carpet Garage for the new basement flooring. New laptop computer was purchased for Administrative Asst. Summer offerings are down. Motion by Sharon to approve the report with a second by Julie. All passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Janelle reported her two weeks in Wartburg College were fulfilling. Fun to experience and be part of the entire group on campus. Old Business: Pianist has been filled for the summer. LouAnn ordered a new sign to put on back door that reflects the building is storm shelter.

New Business: Lobby door continually opens because of wind. LouAnn will look into pricing on either getting a new door or fixing the existing. Present door was installed in 1975. Next meeting will be July 12 at 6:30 PM.

Julie made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second by Lesley. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.


