






As we approach September, I am reminded of how fortunate our two congregations have been the last couple of years with our pastoral internship students. Small churches struggle so it was an easy decision to test out the internship program when Shar Gumke from the synod made the call that day to see if we would be interested in

working with Meggie Bjertness. Another new program, the TEEM program, was proposed to us with the possibility of having Pastor Janelle work with our congregations. For someone who worked with Meggie and now works with Pastor Janelle (who has been with us for one year), I can easily state they were healing forces for our congregations, and for that I say, "thank you."

Recently the St. John's Church celebrated its 150th anniversary and that day was perfect. While we had undergone sweltering heat for the days prior to the celebration, that day was perfect with a breeze and no rain. As I sat in the church that day, I was reminded of how much my mom loved going to the annual celebrations at St. John's. As some of you might have noticed, several of the old photos showed many of our parents out there on the annual cleaning days. I recall how mom was always happy to help Joe Flaa dig out the chandelier and get it hung back in place for a special service. She would have been in the front row if she had been at the celebration! On the second page of this Echo, in the bottom right corner, is a scanned photo that Donovan and Jean Loff gave me with an attached note from Geneva Flaa. This was a picture that Leonard Flaa took many years ago of St. John's Church that he submitted to a photo contest and won. Any of you "over 50" folks know that Leonard was known for snapping pictures of everyone in attendance at every event. At the time we may have been frustrated to have to take "just one more" picture, but it is these memories that stick with us.

Another milestone was reached yesterday as we signed the closing papers selling the Emmanuel parsonage. After five years of being mostly vacant, it made the decision easier to sell the parsonage while home sales are good. Selling a piece of property that had been deeded to us in 1895 "via a piece of onion skin paper" created a few obstacles but we were able to conquer them. The parsonage, built in 1926, was a place for our former pastors to be close to our congregations. Those early days were times when people didn't just get in their car and drive to Fargo or Wahpeton on an almost daily basis. People and times have changed – and that is okay! As we completed the closing, our realtor gave us a book she had made containing pictures of the entire inside and outside of the parsonage as it is now. She printed the following on the last page:

"For many years, this home was a blessing and a refuge for the pastors of Emmanuel Lutheran Church – and now may this home continue to bless the individuals and families who live here for many years to come!"

Thank you to everyone who helped in any way over the past 96 years keeping that parsonage looking as great as it looks today. Happy Fall! Lou Ann Lee

The time has slipped by quickly this summer for me so I'm a bit late with this reminder. The InGathering for school kits and quilts is coming up in October. Many of you may have begun gathering items for the school kits based on previous year lists. If anyone is unable to shop for items money can be donated to purchase items to complete kits. Please have any items to either of the churches by the end of September. Here is a reminder of the items that go into the kits:

One sturdy drawstring backpack- style cloth bag
Four 70-sheet notebooks
One box of 16 or 24 crayons
One pencil sharpener
One 30-centimeter ruler
One pair of blunt scissors
Five unsharpened No. 2 pencils
Five black or blue ball-point pens (not gel pens)
One 2-1/2" eraser

I am happy to report that eight to nine ladies are now involved in making quilts, both at Emmanuel or by sewing at home. If you know of others who may be interested, all are welcome to join us. In the months ahead we will be accepting fabric for the quilts and fillers/batting to make warm quilts for those in need at home and around the world. As we walk — even through dark valleys — we're never alone. God promises, "I will walk among you and be your God" (Leviticus 26:12, NIV).

We have high expectations for attendance, worship attendance/sermon notes, and participation because we truly desire for your child to grow in their faith. Confirmation is not a graduation from church, but it is just the beginning of their faith journey. Christ walks with them and loves them just as they are and continues throughout their lifetime. Confirmation is
