Two thousand years ago in Bethlehem, the world received a significant gift-the birth of Jesus who came to walk among us and save us from our sins. And that's what we celebrate every Christmas. For centuries, Christians have anticipated Christmas Day with a month-long observance called Advent.

Advent comes from the Latin "adventus" and means "coming." In this instance, it is the coming of the prophesied Messiah. As the saints of old anticipated the coming of Christ with great expectation, we too eagerly await His return.

The four weeks of Advent, beginning the Sunday of November 27 through midnight Christmas Eve, represent the four significant "comings" of Christ. First is His coming in the flesh, His birth, which we celebrate on Christmas Day. Second, His coming into the hearts of all who believe in Him. The third is His coming at the hour of death to the faithful. And lastly, His arriving at the final judgment. To symbolize this progression, Christians use the Advent wreath and candles.

Advent wreaths are attributed to Martin Luther (1483-1546), a German priest who initiated the Protestant Reformation. They're designed using evergreen branches to form a never-ending circle. The circle and the evergreen branches symbolize the promise of

eternal life through Christ. Four candles (three blue and one pink) are placed on the wreath representing the four Sundays of Advent. The three blue candles symbolize penance and the fourth pink candle reminds us of the incredible joy that awaits us with the arrival of the Christ child. A fifth candle, generally white and placed in the center of the wreath, is the Christ candle lit on Christmas Eve in honor of His birth.

Advent is more than a holiday, a tradition of remembrance, or memorial. It is a time of spiritual cleansing and growth in Christ. Since the early saints, it has been a time of penitence, fasting, reflection, and seeking the Lord. But currently, we tend to lose sight of this in the hustle and bustle of school and church activities, shopping, baking, and wrapping.

Using the Advent wreath, we can keep our focus on the birth of God's Son at Christmastime. Let the four Advent candles remind us of the hope, peace, love, and joy this season offers us now and always. I hope that in observing this tradition, your family will draw closer together and create

wonderful new memories and lasting traditions to enjoy year after year.

Most of all, I pray this journey brings you a more profound, more
meaningful communion with our Lord Jesus, the One who came to save us
all.

"Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight. I will put my spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. In his name, the countries will put their hope" (Matthew 12:18, 21).

A collaboration across time and place

For Christmas Day worship, many churches use Psalm 98. It is fitting, then, that Isaac Watts, who interpreted 132 psalms as hymn texts, based a now-beloved carol on it.

Watts (1674-1748) was a student of language, religion and philosophy. He wanted to make Scripture more relevant to lay people and thought hymns could help. Watts composed more than 600 hymn texts, many still in use. But Psalm 98:4-9, "Joy to the World," needed music to fit its words.



Enter Lowell Mason (1792-1872), an American choir director. He came across Watts' Psalm 98 hymn text and sought inspiration for a melody from the famous oratorio *Messiah* by George F. Handel (1685-1759). Mason pulled musical phrases from sections of Handel's work, resulting in the tune we now recognize as "Joy to the World."

So it is that three men who lived across three centuries and never met — along with the composer of the original psalm more than two millennia earlier — together produced a hymn to the Christ-child, which millions have sung and continue to love.







