(The following article was published in the Forum one year ago and written by Devlyn Brooks, a local pastor, regarding annual meetings. Since we are soon to hold our annual meetings, I found this article relevant.)

Finding Faith: Annual meeting a reminder of church vitality

I love our annual meeting, maybe even more so than actual our worship services. We held ours this past Sunday. Every annual meeting, I get to see so many of the same folks, sitting in the same exact seat in which they were sitting last annual meeting. And that brings me great joy.

The opposite is true, as well, of course. I also see who is not in the same seat as last year. Some are saints that have passed on; others have become homebound; and still others are just inexplicably absent and you'll never know why. This saddens me.

Nonetheless, I love the annual meeting because it is timeless, and it connects us to the founding members going back a hundred years.

Truthfully, this is where I see "church" happening. Sure, as a pastor, there is an electric charge I get every Sunday during worship when I take to the pulpit in front of our congregation. I am renewed by the liturgy we speak; I am recharged by the hymns we sing; and I will never take for granted the trust that my congregation places in me with the sermon I prepare each week.

But, come annual meeting time, this is where the corporeal body of Christ shows itself in all of its majesty. In our church, we teach and preach that each member is a part of the actual body of Christ. We each are the hands and feet that carry his message of grace into the world, and so in his name, we each commit the acts of love that allow Jesus to become real for others.

And this all begins each year at the annual church meeting. This is where, as a group of Jesus followers, they vote to set a financial budget that allows the church to carry out its mission; democratically elect new members to the church's governing council; and vote on matters that will effectively guide their faith and their church.

Today, when so many do not see the need for church, or ask what the point is because after all the "church" is dying, I say to them, come join us for our annual meeting. Our small, rural, Lutheran parish will show you that while the "church" may be changing, we are certainly not dying. In fact, coming off a challenging year and a half of figuring out how to be "church" during a pandemic, there was a palpable electricity running through Sunday's annual meeting. One just had to see the joy in the faces of those gathered to know that the Holy Spirit was as energized and active in that fellowship hall as she ever was!

Yes, we are adapting as necessary to our circumstances, but our doors are still open and we are still preaching the Good news every Sunday, just as we have for the last century. So come visit, and you'll know that the church isn't dying!

Galchutt Church Council met on December 28, 2022, at 6:30 PM at Galchutt Lutheran Church. Alex read the November secretary's report with Al accepting the report and Daniel seconded. Kendra presented the treasury report. Kendra mentioned that she has had issues with Wells Fargo in the last few weeks. Jimmy accepted the report and Al seconded.

OLD BUSINESS: Annual meeting will be January 18 at 6:30 PM at Galchutt Lutheran Church. Advent event went good with 35 people in attendance.

NEW BUSINESS: Council made a motion to look at moving away from Wells Fargo and switching banks, Kendra will do research on the best bank to switch to, topic to be discussed at annual meeting. All accepted the motion and Daniel seconded. Kendra mentioned in the past that we have donated half of our yearly coffee fund. Jimmy made a motion to donate approximately \$1,200 to the homeless kits that the Sunday school puts together yearly, the PBJ/Angel Fund at Richland School, Breckenridge School, and Northern Cass school, and a Christmas gift to our 3 employees (pastor, admin, and organist). Pastor Janelle proposed a \$250 NDSU Crossroads donation. Kendra presented the 2023 yearly budget. Council approved adding a benevolence addition to the donation of Crossroads and a yearly raise to the office administrator, organist, and pastor. Alex made a motion to recommend the 2023 budget to the congregation at the annual meeting and Daniel seconded. There will be a Zoom option for the annual meeting for anyone that cannot attend in person.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Janelle reported she had 282 miles in November and 331 miles in December. The meaning of Epiphany

Epiphany, which comes from the Greek word epiphaneia, means "an appearance" or "a revealing."



Centuries ago, the church set aside January 6, the 12th day after Christmas, to mark the revealing of Jesus as Christ to the wise men, who were Gentiles. Jesus' first followers were Jewish, so the revelation of the divine Christ to the non-Jewish magi reminds us that Jesus came to earth to save the whole world.

Symbols of Epiphany include light, a star, a crown (or three crowns) and a globe or stylized portrayal of the world. The color of Epiphany is green to symbolize life, growth, hope and eternity.

On the church calendar, the Epiphany season lasts until Ash Wednesday, which is determined by the date of Easter.
