



The personal care kits are especially needed in Ukraine, Turkey, and Syria where they have been seriously impacted in recent weeks and months.

Mary's "yes" calls us to love

On March 25, we remember the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel visits Mary to tell her she is to bear the Son of God, and she says yes. This day reminds all Christians of the time when the Virgin Mary was asked by the Lord to bring into the world a Savior who would be named Jesus.

In Wholehearted Faith, Rachel Held Evans writes: "I am a Christian not because of anything I've done but because a teenage girl living in occupied Palestine at one of the most dangerous moments in history said yes — yes to God, yes to a wholehearted call she could not possibly understand ... yes to a vision for herself and her little boy of a mission that would bring down rulers and lift up the humble, that would turn away the rich and fill the hungry with good things, that would scatter the proud and gather the lowly, yes to a life that came with no guarantee of her safety or her son's. ... And through Mary's example, God invites us to take the risk of love."

Prove it!

In *Jesus Christ, Superstar*, King Herod mocks the bound prisoner who's brought to his courtyard. "So, you are the Christ. You're the great Jesus Christ!" he sings. "Prove to me that you're no fool: Walk across my swimming pool!"

Likewise, the Pharisees demand evidence that Jesus is speaking for God (see Matthew 12:38). It's easy to poke fun at them, but have you ever faced a tough decision and thought, "If only God would give me a sign"?

Jesus tells the religious teachers about the "sign of Jonah," a metaphor for his upcoming death and resurrection. Though it's meant to be a sign for all, not everyone accepts it as truth. Luke 16:31 notes that if the rich man's brothers weren't predisposed to listen to Moses and the prophets, then "they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead" (NIV). Signs are useful only to people who accept their messages and act accordingly.

Logan called the meeting to order. Pastor Janelle led us in devotions. The council held re-organization elections. Logan is President. Kyle is Vice President. Kendra is Treasurer. David is Secretary.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Janelle reported her January mileage. She conducted two funerals plus visits and phone calls. Pastor Janelle has five more weeks of Clinical Pastoral Education at Sanford Hospital. Pastor Janelle will be on vacation from February 28 until March 5. The First Communion will be at the Maundy Thursday service. The next meeting will be held March 20 at 6:30 PM.
