This is the season of Easter. We wait for new life in the spring around us, watching snow melt, flowers bloom, birds return, proclaiming ourselves resurrection people, knowing that we too will have life after death. Our revitalization comes as we journey with Christ asking questions, praying, and

looking to discover how He will appear in our lives, our churches and communities.

Sometimes, however, we miss the big picture of the resurrection as we focus on the details. Limited as we are in our human understanding, we view this miracle in more manageable bites: Jesus Christ was born; He lived and ministered among us; He died; He was raised; He will come again. But in doing so, we can sometimes miss the magic of the whole event-how God reached down and with one man changed life itself. The entire story of Jesus, from birth through resurrection, is God's number one act, His grand hurrah. How can we understand this? The incident on the road to Emmaus can guide us, offering a glimpse into the whole mystery: Two disciples, after witnessing the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ, are wrapped up in these events not realizing until later that these experiences were only part of a whole plan. Like these men, we too may walk through life with blinders, marking each separate event in Jesus's life. But how much sweeter it is when we can penetrate beyond the cross and tomb and find ourselves initiated into the mystery of the resurrection, knowing conquered death frees us to live. Royce J. Scherf's hymn says it best:

> O God of life's great mystery, We bring you this hopeful plea: Give us insight strong and keen, The joyful sense of things unseen.

Through preaching of the living Word, In sacraments of water poured, With eucharistic bread and wine, Bring us the gift of life divine.




Reveal yourself to us in this season of Easter and throughout the year; give us your word so we might continue in your love and mercy. God's blessings to you all.

In all my years, I only recall two Memorial Days that we were not around to honor those veterans who have passed. Summer vacation always starts for us the weekend after Memorial Day. The Galchutt Lutheran Church council met on April 12, 2023, at 7 PM. Members present were Pastor Janelle, Logan Biffert, Larry Wold, David Fixen, Natalie Caulkins, Jim Overby and Al Muhs. President Logan called the meeting to order. Pastor Janelle led us in devotions. The minutes from the March 20 meeting were read by David. Logan presented the treasurer's report.

Pastor Janelle had 224 miles in March. She has completed her CPE training. Pastor Janelle has been busy writing term papers in preparation for her May 5th endorsement interview meeting.

The council will continue to look for a new vacuum and a new fridge. Emmanuel Lutheran Council Highlights

The Emmanuel Church Council met on April 11, 2023, with the following members present: Pastor Janelle, Lou Ann Lee, Fred Tol, Craig Syvertsen, Katrina Heyen, Sharon Tschakert and Tessa Tschakert. Meeting was called to order by President Craig and Pastor Janelle led us in devotions.

Secretary's Report: Report was read by Tessa. Motion made and seconded to approve report. Treasurer's Report: Lou Ann reported that Galchutt has transferred the Echo Fund to Emmanuel. Sponsors for the Echo are needed. Donation is \$100 per month. She also reported working with a representative from Thrivent to discuss investment options and will see what works to get a meeting date scheduled. We are on track for our budget. Motion made and seconded to approve report. Pastor's Report: Pastor Janelle completed her Clinical Pastoral Education. Graduation was on March 30, 2023. Her endorsement interview will be in May. She is happy to be close to completion. Last dates of confirmation are in April. Pastor Janelle helps Pastor Jule with the youth in our community and has 21 students in confirmation. Mileage for March is 224 miles. A motion was made and seconded to approve mileage.

Stewardship: Membership drive will start this spring. Committee will meet with Pastor Janelle and set up dates. More to follow.

Education: Lou Ann reported that Sunday school has 2 more dates in April. We may plan a once-amonth evening session this summer prior to the worship service.

Worship: No report.

Property: Ceiling is leaking above the entry on the back of church. It is a flat roof and will need to be repaired when the snow melts and equipment can get behind the church. Ceiling tiles in Upstad room along with the stairway will need to be replaced after repairs are done. Looking for someone to mow for the summer.

Old Business: Bids are still being researched for replacement of hardware on front door. **New Business**: Pastor Janelle will need an Internship Committee, two from each parish who will meet monthly with her for a year. Galchutt has chosen to keep normal Sunday worship throughout the summer. Emmanuel has chosen to have their weekly worship on Wednesday nights at 7:30 PM starting May 31. Next meeting will be May 9, 2023, at 6:30 PM. Lou Ann made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second by Tessa. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Before distributing the elements, the pastor apologized to congregants,

explaining that his hands were washed but just stained. Years later, Purdum reflected: "Now that I have a fuller grasp of theology under my belt, I think a better thing for me to say would have been, 'Nobody comes to Communion with clean hands.'" We're all unworthy to receive Jesus' body and blood, but that's exactly why he offers it.
