
in front of us, with the beauty of the lily in its elegant purity, and the mystery and power of the tiniest seed, bursting to life as it was always destined to do.

As you have read or will read in the Council minutes I have volunteered to start a monthly newsletter which is currently nameless. It is my hope that through this means we can keep all members informed of the activities and needs of Emmanuel Lutheran Church. I would also propose to use the newsletter to share joys and sorrows of the members and friends of our congregation.

LWR News

We are soon ready to start our annual drive for school kits. Per the LWR website: "Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty.... Lutheran World Relief School Kits contain essential supplies to help children — and in some cases, adults — continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities."



Each kit is put inside a $14" \times 17"$ cloth bag with drawstring (no standard backpack) and needs to contain the following:

- FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide-or college-ruled paper, 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper
- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ONE pencil sharpener
- ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ONE 2 ½" eraser

There will be collections boxes at each church and we will put the kits together later. Once again, thank you in advance for your support of these worthy missions!! We will collect items through September.

Galchutt Lutheran Council Highlights

The Galchutt Lutheran Church council met on July 10 at 7 PM. Members present were Pastor Janelle, Al Muhs, Larry Wold, Logan Biffert, Natalie Caulkins and David Fixen. President Logan called the meeting to order. Pastor Janelle led us in devotions.

The council approved the minutes of the June 6 meeting. Pastor Janelle had 362 miles in June. Pastor Janelle officiated 2 burials and attended the Synod Assembly. There are 21 young people from Our Saviors, Richland, Emmanuel and Galchutt churches who are planning to attend the Youth Gathering in New Orleans next year. Pastor Janelle's Internship started June 15. The Internship committee will meet July 24. Pastor Dave Adams will conduct the July 23 Sunday service and Pastor Sonja Kjar will conduct the July 30 Sunday service.

A fridge only refrigerator is quite expensive and hard to find, so the council will probably go with a freezer/fridge setup. A motion for allocating a \$1,000.00 expenditure on a new fridge was approved. The propane tank has been filled. A new dehumidifier has been purchased for the basement. A shingle is missing from the southeast side of the steeple. Logan will check with a roofer to get his opinion of the situation. There will be no Sunday service on September 3. Rally Sunday is scheduled for September 17. The Echo needs monthly sponsors.

The next meeting will be August 10 at 7 PM. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.



This service goes out to four towns in Richland and Wilkin counties with a limited supply of items, since it is contained in a trailer. However, the Richland-Wilkin Food Pantry in Wahpeton is open to any family that needs assistance with food. Going directly to the Food Pantry in Wahpeton allows a larger amount of food to be distributed to families in need. There is no income requirement, just be a resident of these counties. So, if you are struggling, please use this service.

On the other hand, the pantry would be grateful if you are able to provide food or monetary amounts. Do you have an excess amount of produce from your garden that could be offered? If so, please check their hours to bring your excess produce items to the pantry.
