Emmanuel Lutheran Council Highlights

The Emmanuel Church Council met on October 10, 2023, with the following members present: Pastor Janelle, LouAnn Lee, Katrina Heyen, Craig Syvertsen, Fred Tol, Sharon Tschakert, and Tessa Tschakert. Meeting called to order by President Craig.

Secretary's Report: Report from September was read and approved.

Treasurer's report: LouAnn reported we are on budget for expenses for the year. Motion was made and approved to accept the report.

Pastor's Report: Mileage for September was 226 miles. Approved. She had her 3-month check-in with Wartburg on September 18 by Zoom with Pastor Jule present. Confirmation started September 13 with 20 students, two from Galchutt and two possible coming from Emmanuel. Confirmation for 7th and 8th graders meet 3:30 – 5 and 9th graders meet a couple times a month at 5 PM. Cost for the cookies for the school was \$117.40 for each of the six churches.

Stewardship: Meatball Dinner/Bake Sale and Raffle is on December 3. Tickets are being printed. **Education**: Sunday School started on October 1st.

Worship: Pastor Janelle and Lou Ann have the songs selected until Advent since the worship committee has not met due to harvest and other conflicts.

Property: Fred sprayed the yard for weeds and will spray the cemetery next.

Old Business: Dinner church is being moved from October 29th to November 5th.

New Business: The Stitching Hearts Quilts of Valor group purchased a rolling metal cart for the church as a thank-you for using the facility. November 22 is Thanksgiving service at 7 PM at Emmanuel with pie afterwards. November 26 is an Advent festival at Emmanuel this year from 5-7:00 with potluck. Christmas Eve worship at Emmanuel is at 5:30 PM. There will be no Sunday morning service on that date. December 31 will be normal service again. The meatball dinner was discussed. Craig will check on getting the meat again at Park River. Wes and Shirley Berg donated a \$250 Thrivent gift card to be used for supplies for the dinner.

Next meeting will be November 14, 2023, at 6:30 PM. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Harvest time!

With harvest underway or imminent, fields of ripe grain, tall cornstalks and soybeans turning brown recall Jesus' words to the disciples: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38, ESV).

Nowadays farmers use fewer laborers and bigger machines than in decades past. But what about harvests of faith? Leading people to know God's love can't be done "mechanically." Studies show that newspaper ads or door-hangers left anonymously are less effective at bringing people to church than a warm personal invite.

Right after urging his disciples to pray for harvest workers — in a classic instance of "You might be God's answer to your own prayer!" — Jesus sends them out as those very laborers! How will they work the harvest? Not by guilting people into faith. Not by pronouncing judgment or biblical law. But by using Jesus' authority to counter evil, illness and brokenness among those they befriend.

Ponder and pray about where Jesus is sending you as his laborer to cultivate and reap Christian faith and assurance of God's love.
