The first Sunday of Lent began with Psalm 25:1-10. We prayed this psalm remembering, like all the prayers of God's people, it is relational. This means that when we pray for help, we are not merely summoning God to perform a service but actually placing our trust and hope in Him to guide us because of our special relationship. Then as we wait, we don't sit around and do nothing, we prepare and are ready to act when the time of God's deliverance arrives.



The element of preparation involves learning the Lord's ways and truth under the instruction of God. We study scripture, spend time in prayer, and come to worship. During this season of Lent, I hope we all turn to God and ask Him to remind us to trust, love, and have compassion for each other so we are then able to reach out and share this with others.

May Psalm 25: 1-10 be your prayer during the Lenten journey:

To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul. My God, I put my trust in you; let me not be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me. Let none who look to you be put to shame; rather, let those be put to shame who are treacherous. Show me your ways, O Lord, and teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; in you have I trusted all the day long. Remember, O Lord, your compassion and love, for they are from everlasting. Remember not the sins of my youth and my transgressions; remember me according to your steadfast love and for the sake of your goodness, O Lord. You are gracious and upright, O Lord; therefore, you teach sinners in your way. You lead the lowly in justice and teach the lowly your way. All your paths, O Lord, are steadfast love and faithfulness to those who keep your covenant and your testimonies.



Teach me your ways, O Lord, *Pastor Janelle*.

The reorganization meeting of the Galchutt Lutheran Church council took place on February 7th at 6 PM. Members present were Pastor Janelle, Logan Biffert, Scott Fixen, Larry Wold, David Fixen, Jim Overby, Kyle Krump and Alex Paczkowski. President Logan called the meeting to order. Pastor Janelle led us in devotions.

The council moved on to regular business. David read the December meeting minutes; Larry approved the amended minutes to change the wording of executive committee verses call committee to call on Pastor Janelle after her schooling. Scott seconded the minutes. PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Janelle had 555 miles, she made visits to the homebound in Wahpeton and Fargo. On Ash Wednesday she will visit the homebound for them to receive ashes. Galchutt had its annual meeting, Pastor Janelle met with Deacon Laura and she will be approved by May 3rd for ordination at the end of June. A pastor contract should be received by the end of March/beginning of April to stay on schedule. Scott approved and Larry seconded the pastor's report. There was no treasurer's report.

OLD BUSINESS: The shingles still need to be looked at on St. Johns steeple.

NEW BUSINESS: Doug Kuruc will mow again this summer and the mower is in good working condition. The tree by the road on the church grounds needs to be cut down. The council will take it down once the ground freezes up again. The propane is at 38% and David will call to fill it up. St. Johns will be closed again so truck drivers don't use the driveway to turn around. First Communion class will be held February 28th before Lent service for all 3rd graders or whoever is interested. Pastor Janelle mentioned that she is looking into starting a book club. Confirmation has 16 kids and is going well with 3 adult teachers. This year there are 2 Galchutt and 2 Emmanuel students. Council will look into changing lights in the fellowship hall to LED. Council scheduled the next meeting for March 19 at 5:30 PM. Meeting adjourned with the Lords Prayer.

Old Business: None.



Next Council Meeting will be Tuesday March 12 at 7:00 PM.


We closed with the Lord's Prayer led by Pastor Janelle.



Corrie ten Boom, a devout Christian who helped shelter hundreds of Jewish people from Nazis during World War II, was asked how she stayed humble despite her fame.

"When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday on the back of a donkey, and everyone was waving palm branches and throwing garments onto the road and singing praises, do you think that for one moment it ever entered the head of that donkey that any of that was for him?" she replied. "If I can be the donkey on which Jesus Christ

rides in his glory, I give him all the praise and all the honor."

Jesus told his followers they'd need to carry (or "take up") their cross. But how well do you carry your Savior? How do you bring him into a world that desperately needs the good news of the gospel?

# God's provision while we wait

A November 2023 landslide trapped 41 construction workers in a tunnel they'd been excavating for a Himalayan highway project. For 17 days, they were stranded nearly 3 miles from freedom. When rescuers' drilling equipment broke, miners drilled through the last 2 meters of rock and gravel by hand. Finally, all the workers were pulled to safety through a 3-foot-wide steel pipe. Because they had received food, water, medicines, oxygen and even light through a narrow pipe while underground, all were in good health.

We are trapped in sin and brokenness: our sin and that of others, fragmented relationships and systems, nearby and across the globe. Christianity teaches that God's way of goodness will win in the end. But before full rescue comes, what keeps us alive and hopeful — even healthy? As water was faithfully provided to the laborers through that narrow pipe, God quenches our thirst through baptism. Scripture and the sacrament of communion are the food and medicine that nourish and strengthen us. Prayer our own and others' prayers for us — along with the Holy Spirit's gifts such as comfort and joy flow into our lives like the light of hope and the oxygen of life. Though complete rescue seems slow to come, God provides for us while we wait.
