

September 8, 2019, is the date set for the 2019 "God's work. Our hands" Sunday. The mission statement of the ELCA reads: "Together in Jesus Christ we are freed by grace to live faithfully, witness boldly and

serve joyfully." Since 2013, thousands of ELCA congregations have participated in this dedicated day of service, gathering to



serve communities in ways that share the love of God with all of God's people. The event has quickly become an anticipated way to be "church together" and "church for the sake of the world." As stated by the ELCA:

Whether your congregation prepares and delivers meals to people who are homeless, cleans parks and beaches or writes thank-you notes to emergency responders, your service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: All of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life – flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

While I have not personally heard of any God's Work, Our Hands activities planned for this date in our two churches, remember that it doesn't need to be set aside for only one specific day during the year. Ways that some of you are already showing your "God's Work, Our Hands" spirit throughout the year are through teaching Sunday School, visiting the elderly or homebound members of our congregations and bringing them news from the congregation, quilting for the needy such as the Lutheran World Relief drives, collecting school kits for the needy, helping with activities in your community, offering support to someone struggling with any number of topics, and the list can go on and on. As we look forward to renewal within the parish, how would you like to share the benefits God provides by the work of your "hands" (including time, caring for the oppressed and those in need of a friendly visit or hand, prayer). All "hands" are needed to do God's work.

FREE DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAM OFFERED

North Dakota State University Extension, Essentia Health, and Sanford Health have teamed up to offer a diabetes prevention program.

The National Diabetes Prevention Program is being offered at <u>no cost</u> to area residents. This lifestyle change program includes education and support for people with prediabetes and those at a high risk for prediabetes, and is designed to help people lose weight, be more active, and to prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes.

Participants meet for a year - weekly for 13 weeks, twice a month for 4 months and then once a month for 4 months, to maintain healthy lifestyle changes. Together participants celebrate their successes and find ways to overcome obstacles.
